BUSES & SHUTTLES

SKAGIT TRANSIT - Service reductions and suspensions extended indefinitely

- Route 409 (Anacortes) – Service Suspended

- Route 410 (WA State Ferry-March's Point) – Operates Monday-Saturday on the published <u>SATURDAY</u> schedule. Does not operate on Sunday.

 Route 40X (Mount Vernon-March's Point) – Operates Monday-Saturday on the published <u>SATURDAY</u> schedule. Does not operate on Sunday.
OTHER ROUTES MAY BE SUSPENDED OR ARE OPERATING ON REDUCED

- BELLAIR AIRPORTER SHUTTLE All services to/from Anacortes, Burlington, Paine Field, Seattle and SeaTac Airport are suspended through June 20. Service on the Interstate-5 route between Bellingham, Burlington, Seattle and SeaTac Airport will resume on June 21 with five daily round trips. <u>Connecting service between</u> <u>Anacortes and Burlington will remain suspended until travel demands increase</u>. Service to/from Paine Field is suspended through July 31.
- GREYHOUND[^] Service at Mount Vernon to/from Seattle and Vancouver, BC is suspended. From Mount Vernon, one daily trip to Seattle and one daily trip to Bellingham are offered on Greyhound subsidiary BoltBus.

FERRIES

WASHINGTON STATE FERRIES - <u>WINTER 2020</u> schedule will operate through Saturday, June 20 with additional service reductions on Seattle area routes: (Fauntleroy/Vashon/Southworth, Seattle/Bainbridge, Seattle/Bremerton, Edmonds/Kingston, Mukilteo/Clinton). Beginning on June 21 the Winter 2020 schedule will serve as the "Baseline" schedule with service being expanded throughout the route system as vessels, crews and funding become available and as ridership increases. Service to/from and within the San Juan Islands and service between Coupeville and Port Townsend will continue to operate on the printed Winter 2020 (now "Baseline") schedule without any planned reductions. Service reductions on other routes will remain in effect after June 20. Service to and from Sidney, BC is suspended and is subject to the re-opening of the U.S.-Canadian border to non-essential travel in addition to the availability of vessels, crews, funding and ridership.

***BLACK BALL FERRY LINE^** – All service between Port Angeles and Victoria, BC is suspended through **July 31**. Service in **August** is subject to the re-opening of the U.S.-Canadian border to non-essential travel.

<u>RAIL</u>

- AMTRAK[^] Rail service at Mount Vernon to/from Seattle and Vancouver, BC is suspended. Amtrak Thruway bus service provides one daily trip between Mount Vernon and King Street Station in Seattle exclusively for Amtrak connecting passengers.
- ^ Services increases and resumptions by Greyhound and Amtrak at Mount Vernon and by Black Ball Ferry Line at Port Angeles are all tied directly to the reopening of the U.S. – Canadian border to non-essential travel. These services should not be expected to increase or resume until the border reopens.
